29th World Day for Consecrated Life:

Today, we honor the men and women who have consecrated their lives to God through the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. It is also an occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and to renew the fervor which inspired them to offer themselves to the Lord. In 2022, there were more than 250 religious institutes and societies of apostolic life in Canada with a total of



9,572 women and men. They are involved in pastoral services of the Church in parishes, schools and colleges, health institutions, social services for the poor and the missions. In addiction, there were others who live lives of prayer and contemplation while others live as hermits. On February 2nd, a Mass at 10:30 am to be celebrated by Bishop Wayne Kirkpatrick at St. Ninian Cathedral.

World Day for Consecrated Life, on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, is a day of prayer and celebration for people who have consecrated their lives to God through vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Celebration of this day of prayer allows parishes to highlight the gift of religious life and pray for those discerning a religious vocation.

The following prayer, written for the World Day for Consecrated Life, is provided courtesy U.S. bishops' Secretariat of Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations.

"God our Father, we thank you for calling men and women to serve in your Son's Kingdom as sisters, brothers, religious priests, consecrated virgins, and hermits, as well as members of Secular Institutes. Renew their knowledge and love of you and send your Holy Spirit to help them respond generously and courageously to your will. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."
